We help individuals from autistic kids to pensioners with dementia, and all else in between.

We cover any local unmet needs covering homelessness, disabled, exclusion, isolation etc. and look to love our neighbours to show we care.


## CHARITY'S £1.6M MILESTONE

A local charity is celebrating its 15th anniversary with news of reaching a £1.6 million milestone of good deeds.

East Renfrewshire Good Causes (ERGC) has helped 5413 individuals since it was founded in 2007.

The charity has also recently expanded its operating area to include other local authority areas in Scotland, including Glasgow, Renfrewshire and Soutl Lanarkshire to name a few.

Some of the varied and, in some cases, potentially life-changing ways the "good neighbour club" has provided help within the last six months include working with a qualified physiotherapist to provide a trial anti-gravity treadmill session for a cancer patient; working with an occupational therapist to provide a smart baby monitor for a low income family with a child with complex medical needs; part funding a wet floor shower for a disabled pensioner on very low income; and grass cutting for a



severely disabled former services person, who was injured while serving overseas.

ERGC was launched by Russell Macmillan, a registered blind man from Newton Mearns, after he received a type 1 diabetes curing pancreas and kidney transplant. He said: "Guided by my Christian faith and thanks to the two

He said: "Guided by my Christian faith and thanks to the two organs living on inside me, I wan to help other people by carrying out acts of kindness in memory o the sadly deceased organ donor. "To surpass gifting £1.6 million in goods and services to deserving individuals as identified by trained frontline workers was beyond my wildest dreams. To think those two organs have now helped more than 5400 individuals is a modern day miracle."
